On behalf of the members of the IDF Widows and Orphans Organization (IDFWO), I'd like to extend my gratitude for your generous donation to help us provide multifaceted support to the families of fallen IDF soldiers.

As the wise Elie Wiesel noted, "Just as despair can come only from other human beings, hope, too, can be given to one only by other human beings." Through your generous donation, you — our friends — have instilled hope in the hearts of the widows and orphans suffering from the loss of a loved one who fell while protecting Israel.

Through your generous donation, we have been able to continue supporting the needs of bereaved families. 
