Cheese Blintzes with Fresh Raspberry Sauce by @TheKosherChef

Raspberry Sauce : 1 cup fresh raspberries 1 tsp lemon juice

4 tbsp sugar

1 tsp water

1. Wash and drain the raspberries.

Put them in a pot with the lemon juice, sugar and water.
 Stir over medium heat for a few minutes until the raspberries let out juice. (The raspberries shouldn't melt)
 Put them over a strainer, and with a spoon squeeze out the juice until only the seeds are left in the strainer.

Crepes:

3 eggs 1 cup milk 1 cup flour 1 tbsp sugar 1/2 tsp salt 2 tbsp vegetable oil 1/4c cold water 1/4 tsp vanilla Filling: 1 1/2 cup ricotta cheese 1/2 cup cream cheese Zest of an orange Punch of salt 2 tbsp confectioners sugar 1 egg



1. In a blender mix all the ingredients together until liquid. Pour into a bowl and let it sit for half an hour.

2. In a bowl mix the ingredients for the filling and stir until smooth. Cover it and put in the fridge to chill.

3. Spray Pam on a medium-high skillet. Pour 1/4 cup of batter into the pan, moving around the pan so the batter spreads evenly around the pan. Let it cook for 1 minute, then flip it for a few more seconds until crisp. Put it in a plate. Keep doing this until you finish the batter. It should make about 10 crepes.

4. Take the crepe. Put 1 spoon of filling at the edge. Fold it over once, flip the sides in, and then roll it twice so the seem is on the bottom. Do this for all the crepes.

5. In a pan, melt 1 spoon of butter, and fry the crepes on each side until crisp.

6. Preheat oven to 325 degrees. Place them in an oiled dish, and bake for 12 minutes. Let them cook, and serve fresh raspberry sauce, and topping of your choice. Enjoy!

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Marriage Committee Report

After several meetings, the Marriage Committee has divided our goals to help our singles into two steps:

First: To try and identify the issues related to marriage.

Second: To provide resources and efforts in finding the appropriate solutions for our singles.

After reviewing comments from prior Marriage Committee meetings, and notes from similar meetings in the past, we have complied a list of important issues related to our singles and the topic of marriage:

1. High wedding costs, in addition to the excessive amount of parties that are expected of the couple during the engagement period (i.e. Proposal Party, Engagement Party, Bridal Shower, Henna Party, etc.)

2. Many young women with important careers and salaries feel little or no pressure to marry because of financial independence. They are also often preoccupied with their careers and do not prioritize dating.

3. Rejection from a girl makes the young man lose confidence and can prevent him from asking others out again.

4. Girls and boys are divided into groups at a young age. Certain groups do not mingle with those who are not associated with their clique; therefore do not branch out to meet other singles.

5. Lashon Hara – The opinions of friends matter and influence decision-making. If a friend shares a negative opinion of a girl or guy, it can prevent someone from giving that person a chance.

6. Lack of more appropriate place for singles to meet and ineffective singles parties.

7. Overexposure – There is too much exposure and singles are socializing with each other too often which can take away the novelty.

8. Getting caught on dates and the fear of the community finding out who is dating whom, which can lead to rumors and conversation. This can scare one or both parties in the relationship, which can potentially end things.

9. Girls rejecting a guy (khastegar) without first consulting with her parents and getting advice. Girls and guys can reject someone for superficial reasons without giving them a chance.

10. Lack of higher education in guys. More girls have college and masters degrees and are seeking the same in a mate partner.

11. Singles and parents do not give a chance to families with different observance level, social status, and financial differences.


